
### **School Enrollment and Demographics**

### **Attendance District**

Bordered on the West by the City of Atlanta and on the South by the City of Decatur, the Druid Hills High School district stretches from I 85 at N. Druid Hills Road to I 285 at Lawrenceville Highway and Memorial Drive and encompasses the City of Avondale Estates to the Southeast.



### **Schedule**

Our school day consists of a 4x4 block schedule for classes. Each student takes four daily 90 - minute classes each semester. In this type of schedule, each semester course is equivalent to a year in a traditional schedule.

### **Curriculum Offerings**

International Baccalaureate (IB), Advanced Placement (AP), Gifted, Advanced (Accel) and General classes are available in each academic area—language arts, math, science, social studies and world language. The school also offers a full complement of classes in health and PE, the fine arts, and career technology. IB and AP classes are college-level classes. Gifted and Accelerated classes are rigorous, exceeding grade-level norms. General classes reflect the grade-level norm. Students have the option to attend Cross Keys which offers technical programs, Fernbank Science Center for independent study and community enrichment, and Dual Enrollment at nearby colleges and universities.

DeKalb County uses a 5.0 weighted grade policy that only affects Advanced Placement, Dual Enrollment, and International Baccalaureate courses:

A = 5, B = 4, C = 3, D = 2, F = 0

A 4.0 system of A = 4, B = 3, C = 2, D = 1, F = 0 will be used for regular and accelerated classes. A cumulative grade point average is computed on all subjects of all students in grade 9 – 12. A core curriculum GPA is computed for these same students using English, math, science, social studies and foreign language courses. DeKalb County School System does not compute rank-in-class.
