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Dual Enrollment – Updated 4/17/2024

Key points:

- Allotted credit hours per student the state will fund (30 credit hours max)
- Approved courses
- 11th & 12th Graders are eligible to take any approved Dual Enrollment course listed on the Course Directory, at an eligible participating postsecondary institution.
- 10th Graders may enroll in approved Career, Technical and Agricultural Education (CTAE) courses listed on the course directory at a participating Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) institution only.

How to Apply

Students should complete their college application and online funding application.

Items to complete by the deadline(s) [Summer/Fall: March 15th & Spring: October 15th]:

- 1. College application (including transcript and test scores if applicable)
- 2. Dual enrollment online funding application and student parent agreement (SPA)

Step 1: College Application

Step 2: Dual Enrollment Online Funding Application and Student Participation Agreement (SPA)

Students must complete the online dual enrollment funding application once per year.



To complete, create an account on <u>www.gafutures.org</u>. Make sure your name, DOB, address, high school, and social security number are correct. Students without an SSN will be provided a GA Futures ID once completing their account.

Once the profile is created, complete the Funding Application and Student Participation Agreement (SPA).

Note: Once you see "pending school approval," you have completed the required funding application and parent agreement.

Step 3: Choose Classes

Find the course(s) you would like to take and **fill out a course request form (see counselor for link)** so that they can be approved for payment. *You may take up to 3 courses for Summer and up to 5 courses for Fall and Spring.*

- **<u>Courses without prerequisites that satisfy graduation requirements</u>**
 - Senior English (British Literature): ENGL 1101
 - **Economics**: ECON 2100, ECON 2105, ECON 2106
 - Fourth Math: MATH 1401, MATH 1101, MATH 1111, MATH 1112, MATH 1113, MATH 2211, MATH 2420
 - Fourth Science: Any Dual Enrollment Science class, ALHS 1011

Step 4: <u>Register for Classes (this step may take place after the deadline)</u>

Once you've been admitted into the college, register for the course(s) <u>with the college</u>. Instructions for registration will be provided by the college. *Filling out the course request form does not register you for the classes, it just approves the classes for payment.* If you make <u>ANY</u> changes to your requested course list, <u>let your counselor know.</u>

- 2. Dual Enrollment online funding application and student parent agreement (SPA)
- 3. Send official transcript to GPTC through <u>GA Futures Account</u> (free) or <u>Parchment.com</u> (charges a fee)
 - To send via GA Futures, a social security number must be on file
- 4. GPA or Test Score requirement GPTC Testing Requirements
 - For summer and fall 2020, GPTC will consider HS GPA's for admission. If you have the below GPA, testing is not required.
 - 2.5 GPA+ for degree level academic courses (English, Math, Science, etc.)
 - 2.0 GPA+ for technical level courses
 - Students that do not meet the GPA requirement can take the Accuplacer test at home
- 5. If you are taking summer courses, email your counselor to discuss course options. Fall courses will be discussed starting in May.

 - Send the transcript to Georgia State University (not Perimeter)
 - To send via GA Futures, a social security number must be on file
- 4. Test Scores GSU Perimeter requires the ACT, SAT, or Accuplacer
 - If you have ACT or SAT test scores, send them to GSU through your ACT or Collegeboard account.
