All HOPE scholarship information can be found on the gafutures.org website. The Georgia Student Finance Commission calculates HOPE eligibility after receiving transcripts from Dekalb County. The school system does not calculate the grade point average for HOPE scholarships. Students can view their preliminary and final eligibility after logging into their account.

MOWR (Move On When Ready)

Interested in earning high school and college credit? The MOWR program allows students to earn college and high school credit (dual credit). Students must meet the specific college admission requirements. All costs for college fees, tuition, and books are covered by state funding. More information can be found on the gafutures.org website.
