Senior Meeting Information

Signing up for your Senior Meeting

• Students will sign up for their meeting time online. The link is on the counseling website, senior page. All seniors will have a meeting.

Senior meetings will last up to 25 minutes.

• You will show your email confirmation to your teacher as your pass to leave class. Sign Up Genius will send you a reminder email 1 day in advance.

• Parents are invited to attend the meeting; however it is not mandatory. Please share your meeting date and time with your parent.

Prior to Your Meeting

- 1. Create an account on www.gafutures.org. Please ensure that you enter your full legal name and social security number. This is important for the HOPE Scholarship as well as the transcript release function.
- 2. Bookmark our <u>counseling website</u> on your phone and computer.
- 3. Research scholarships, colleges, and careers on student's Naviance Account.
- 4. Complete the counseling survey: Class of 2020- Counseling Survey
- 5. Complete the <u>recommendation / brag sheet form</u> and bring it to your meeting or email it to your counselor.



Academic Credits for Graduation

• All credits required for graduation will be reviewed during the student's senior meeting.

• Students will receive their <u>credit checklist</u> as well as GPA information.

Remediation Options

- Flex Academy
 - Beyond the school day (\$250.00 per 1/2 credit hours)
- Credit Recovery (Georgia Virtual)

Summer school (Summer Graduation)

*A student can earn a maximum of 2 additional credits per school year (10 credits total) and a maximum of 2 credits over the summer

Dual Enrollment

• Students can take up to 15 credit hours of college courses at a local public college for free. The credits count for college credit and high school credit.

Spring Dual Enrollment Deadline – Oct. 15th

 All Dual Enrollment information is on the counseling website, main page, dual enrollment tab.





College Search

Develop a <u>college list</u>—Document admissions requirements, application procedures, and application deadlines

<u>College Search Sites</u>—Naviance Account, ACT Student,

- Make sure you have applied to several different colleges
 - Reach College, Match College, "Safety-Net" College

College Tours

 Visit your college of interest and take a tour. Colleges list tour information on their college admissions page.

Seniors receive 2 excused absences for college visits.

• If you are not able to visit in person – look for a 360 tour on the college's website.

College Visits at Druid Hills

 College admissions counselors set up cafeteria and small group visits to share information with seniors

 All information is listed on the college visit calendar on the counseling website

 For small group visits – sign up on the calendar. Email confirmation will be your pass to attend.

Questions for Admissions Counselors

Example questions to ask admissions representatives:

- What is your freshman retention rate?
- What is your graduation rate?
- What is your average class size on campus? What's the student to professor ratio?
- Do most students live on campus as freshman? Is it a requirement?
- What are your top majors at the school?
- What organizations do you all have on campus?
- What services do you provide on the campus that are included in student fees?
 - ie: career services, internship placements, tutorial services, writing center

College Applications

Visit the college's admissions website to determine application method:

Test Scores

• Student is responsible for sending test scores through their ACT or SAT account

Transcripts

- Students will request their transcript to be sent digitally through their Naviance Account
- Mail option Bring \$1 or a Stamped Envelope to Ms. Vicki to request

College Application Data

Senior Class Size: 300

Student Rank: Select "Does not Rank"

Student unweighted and weighted GPA

Visit counseling and request an unofficial copy of your transcript from Ms. Vicki at the counseling desk.

 Additional demographics are located on the school profile on the counseling website (main page)

College Decision Information

If you have questions about what would be the best choice in terms of application type, or how the school calculates GPA/test scores, contact the admissions office directly. The information may also be posted on the admissions website.

Counselor and Teacher Recommendations

• Students should have a conversation with their teacher prior to sending a recommendation request. Ask the teacher — "Do you feel comfortable writing a recommendation for me."

Allow a minimum of two weeks for completion

• Complete the student <u>brag sheet</u> that will help your recommender write a strong and personal recommendation. Include anything that you feel will make you stand out to the college or will help the college get to know you better.

Financially Planning for College

- Net Price Calculator On every college admissions site estimates cost of tuition based off of student information
 - Example: Georgia Gwinnett's Net Price Calculator
- Room and Board and Fees information On College Websites under Financial Aid – many will have an estimation tool
 - Example: Georgia State's <u>estimation tool</u>

FAFSA4caster on <u>fafsa4caster.ed.gov</u> (estimation of federal aid)

Scholarship Search Tips

- Create a spreadsheet including the scholarship name, deadline, link to website, and notes (eligibility requirements, \$ amount, etc.)
- Create a Twitter account and follow @DHHScounseling, @cgreenlight, @payingforschool, @scholarships360, and @fafsa
- Visit the admissions sites of any colleges that you are interested in. See what scholarships they offer to incoming freshman.

Federal Aid for College

Information site: <u>studentaid.ed.gov</u>

- FAFSA Completed after October 1st at <u>fafsa.ed.gov</u>
 - Must create FSA ID prior to completing the FAFSA (located on FAFSA site)
 - Will need Guardian Tax information including 1040, 1040A, or 1040ez along with the W2
 - FAFSA Application must be completed every year in college

Financial Aid Package

Students will receive their financial aid package after being accepted into a college. Make sure you have listed your college code on the FAFSA application.

If adding a new college to your application – you must resubmit.

Final HOPE GPA will not be available until early July.

HOPE Scholarship

- HOPE eligibility information is listed on gafutures.org
- HOPE Scholarship requires course rigor and a 3.0 grade point average in core classes and covers approximately 75-80% of tuition at a public Georgia college (HOPE amount varies per college- you can look up award amounts on GA Futures).
- Zell Miller Scholarship requires course rigor and a 3.7 grade point average in core classes, a 26 ACT composite or a 1200 SAT (verbal and math only), and covers 100% of tuition at a public Georgia college.
- Eligibility is determined by Georgia Student Finance Commission after the student graduates from high school. The HOPE GPA is not calculated by Dekalb County.
- Social Security Card must be on file with the high school to be eligible for HOPE.

GAfutures.org

All students should create an account. Make sure to use the student's full legal name and social security number.

Student accounts have HOPE GPA.

HOPE Application – <u>FAFSA and/or GSFAPPS</u>

Completing both applications is recommended

HOPE Grant

• **HOPE Grant** information is listed on gafutures.org.

 Georgia's HOPE Grant (a separate program from the HOPE Scholarship) is available to Georgia residents who are working towards a certificate or diploma (continuing education programs are not eligible) at an eligible college or university in Georgia.

 Eligible Colleges and University are located on the gafutures.org website
