High School Diploma: 24 Credits

- 2 world language (*3 for honors)
- 4 electives (3 in a pathway)
- Health/Personal Fitness
- PE

**Honors diploma requires 3 world language credits and a 3.5 weighted GPA*

Promotion Requirements

Promotion to 10th grade -6 credits/3 core

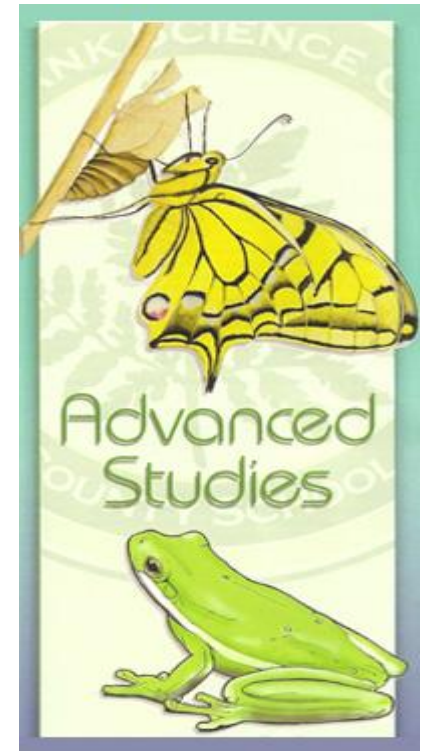
Promotion to 11th grade – 12 credits/6 core

Graduation – 24 credits/12 core
